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Boys Ranch Roughrider to Sign with Midwestern State University

BOYS RANCH, TX — (January 28, 2011) Dejon Haye, Boys Ranch Roughriders' wide receiver and defensive back, will sign with Midwestern State University on Wednesday, February 2, at 2:30 p.m., in the Dippel Gymnasium located on the Cal Farley's Boys Ranch Campus.

The Boys Ranch High School ceremony, which will be held in conjunction with National Signing Day, will include two Roughrider players. It was announced earlier this week that LaQuan McGowan, Boys Ranch Roughriders' offensive and defensive lineman, will officially sign with Baylor University on Wednesday, February 2.

This year's participation in National Signing Day is a first for Boys Ranch High School within its 60-plus year history.

Haye, a charismatic 17-year-old, excels in football, basketball and track. He will be allowed to try out for both wide receiver and defensive back positions with MSU. He plans to major in computer science. Haye is a Waukegan, Illinois native who came to live at Cal Farley's Boys Ranch in 2006.
